Juliana Van Ness, Saint Thomas Aquinas



Omar Elkhouli, North Plainfield



COURACEOUS Wrestler Award

If you watch Gio on the wrestling mat, you may notice that he tends to wrestle with a bit of a chip on his shoulder. When you hear Gio's backstory, the style that he wrestles makes sense. His whole life, he has had to overcome the odds and fight through everything that life has thrown at him that would leave most people unphased.

Gio was born with Hypogammaglobulinemia, a disease that renders the immune system useless due to low serum levels and antibodies. Only 4,700 people worldwide have been diagnosed with the disease, but Gio and his 2 siblings are 3 of them. The disease does not allow for vaccines to be effective because his body cannot produce titers, making any illness life-threatening. A simple cold could put Gio into the hospital because his body cannot fight off these illnesses on its own.

Unfortunately, Gio has had to overcome some major complications in his young life. The first occurred at only 1 week old when he had to have almost 50% of his intestines removed due to Necrotizing Enterocolitis that was spreading throughout his digestive system despite antibiotics. After years of testing, Gio was finally diagnosed with Hypogammaglobulinemia and sent to CHOP in Philadelphia to see specialists. From that point forward, doctors told Gio he would receive monthly IVIG (Intravenous Immunoglobin) infusions to give him enough antibodies to protect his body for the following 21 days. Unfortunately, you can only get the infusions every 28 days, so Gio's body is unprotected to any and all illnesses for 7 days every month. These treatments are the last Friday of the month, lasting 7-9 hours. The infusions also happen to occur the same weekend as the GMC and Region tournaments every year, forcing him to postpone treatment. This has led to Gio coming down with some type of illness each year, slowing him down and impeding his potential during those tournaments.

One of the most serious moments in Gio's life happened when he was in 7th grade; a small pimple on his leg would turn into a Staph Infection, leading to him being hospitalized. Due to his immune deficiency, antibiotics were not working and the disease started spreading down his leg despite multiple surgeries to remove infected tissue. Doctors were preparing to amputate Gio's leg to stop the spread when the last-resort antibiotic finally started to work. Gio's life and leg were both saved, but the scars on his body remind him that he cannot take anything for granted. Every doctor told Gio and his mother said that he should never wrestle again as the risk was too great that skin diseases common with wrestling could put his life in danger again. In addition to this, Gio developed Rheumatoid, restricting his joint movement for the rest of his life.

Gio has a love for this sport that not many others have; he still continues to compete in it despite the risks it poses. The fact that he made it through 4 years of high school with only hiccups is an amazing feat itself, but to talk about how Gio won 124 matches in his high school career, two County titles, three district titles, is a 3-time state qualifier, and now at the end of this career was a State Finalist, makes this story all the more impressive. To top that off, wrestling has allowed him to further his academic and athletic career at Rider University, putting a final ending on this wrestler's High School career which almost never happened.

The name Giordano has been synonymous with South Plainfield wrestling since the 1980's. Coming off a 7th place finish in the State Tournament as a Junior, JJ was primed for an even better Senior season. He dominated his way to a Morris Knolls Championship and would go on the place 5th at the Sam Cali Tournament in an extremely difficult weight class. JJ continued to be a dedicated worker in the room and was extremely coachable and receptive to changing his wrestling style a bit. The change would come with some struggle, but ultimately the benefits of the change could be seen as he became more and more comfortable with it. He would have an undefeated record in the GMC this year and for his entire High School Wrestling Career. Jason went on to capture his 3rd county title and would really start doing his best wrestling of the season as he began to peak for the team and individual postseason. JJ was 4-0 the week of sectionals including defeating two-time state place-winner Jamar Dixon from Delsea (who had defeated him twice this season) by a score of 4-3. This win seemed to give him a tremendous amount of steam going into the District Tournament....Unfortunately, the day before the district tournament JJ got diagnosed with a serious, severe, and very rare form of Staph Infection in his knee. His first thought was, "Ok, I can just get through the first two matches and give myself a week to recover for Regions". Then everyone found out the severity of the infection. The infection began to spread and his knee began to swell like a balloon. The realization of his long-term health and possibly his life being in danger quickly set in. JJ underwent surgery to cut and clear out the infection. After about 8 or 9 days of being in the hospital, the infection began to dissipate, and his body started to respond positively to the antibiotics he was given. While JJ's high school career may have been cut short, the most important outcome was that he will make a full recovery and be able to follow his brother's Jake and Marc as he will continue his educational and wrestling career at TCNJ. The High School coaching staff wishes JJ the best and we look forward to him continuing to make the Giordano name proud! Congratulations JJ on an outstanding high school career and being named GMC Courageous Wrestler of the Year.

Mandy wrestled to an impressive 18-7 record, winning the GMCs for her second time in as many attempts, as well as winning the Central Region. In her first match of the state tournament, she faced the defending state champion Klein of Paramus, and came out on top, securing placement on the state podium once again. Mandy ultimately finished 6th in NJ, and though it was not the position she desired, she solidified herself once again as being among the best in the state of New Jersey.

Mandy will be continuing her wrestling career at Ursinus College, and is currently training for the World Team Trials in Spokane, Washington. Mandy's drive to continue to succeed at the highest levels will only propel her further into the stratosphere of success. Melissa never became discouraged and made up for the few chances with a 4th place finish in the Girls GMC tournament. Despite technically finishing top 20 in the state as a Super Region 5th, he had still not wrestled in the state tournament and he was upset about how the COVID season unfolded.

Junior year, an amazing thing happened for Gio as he went from 5'1" to a 5'9" overnight. The height and weight gain allowed his body to start cashing the checks that his mind had been writing all these years. He won his second District title, first GMC title, and finally qualified for that elusive state tournament he had missed so narrowly twice. However, after falling in the blood round at Beast of the East and Atlantic City, Gio once again felt unfulfilled.

Senior year saw a new Gio step on the mat as he was finally full size for his weight class and looked like he belonged in the 138 pound weight class. To start the season at Beast of the East, he lost in the guarterfinals to the #1 wrestler in the nation Collin Rath 8-3. This left Gio in another precarious position of having to wrestle in a blood round match, which had seemed to stymie him his entire career, but this time he would win his match 5-2 and end up placing 7th at Beast to become St. Joe's first ever placer down at the prestigious tournament. From here Gio would win 30 straight matches against New Jersey's best competition, only falling in a rematch during the Region finals. Down in AC, undeterred from his loss in the Region finals, Gio made a run no one at St. Joe's had ever made. He opened up the state tournament with a fall, and a 5-1 win against a tough Warren Hills opponent. Wayne Rold from Camden Catholic, who Gio defeated Junior year 4-0 was his quarterfinal opponent; Gio found himself in overtime 1-1 and scored on a reattack collecting the win and his first ever State placement in NJ with just 2 seconds left in SV. 

I want to thank the GMCWCA for recognizing me as this year's Ron Mazzola Man of the Year recipient. It is a tremendous honor being the first person to win the award since it was posthumously given to Ron last year and renamed in his honor. I'm celebrating my tenth and final season as the GMCWCA Treasurer. My proudest achievement is the creating the scholarship award and providing a vehicle that may be replicated in order to preserve its existence. Since 2018, I've organized and produced a broadcast of the GMC Finals that has funded the scholarship through various sponsorships. I first covered the GMC Tournament in 2007 by typing the agate (results in the pre-track era) and accurately depicting in-match actions of the finals for award winning reporter Greg Tufaro. This led to providing a live play-by-play blog on mycentraljersey.com. In 2012, the GMCWCA recognized me as "Writer of the Year". In 2016, the blog evolved into a broadcast and not only earned recognition again from the GMCWCA, but inspired the change in the award's name to Media Man of the Year". It was in Atlantic City for the 2017 postseason that I approached Ron about using the broadcast to raise money for a scholarship, In 2018, with the successful debut of sponsoring weight classes and providing the GMCWCA's first scholarship winners, I again earned the Media Man of the Year award.

I began wrestling in 7th grade and by my senior year was coached by Hall of Fame coaches Ken Scott and Gerry Bandola. In the summer of my senior year I helped out the Old Bridge Wrestling Festival. After graduation, I joined the Festival Board with Hall of Fame coach and founder Greg DeMarco and Ron Mazzola. It was during the Festival that I was persuaded by longtime referee Charlie Perez to become a wrestling official. Following graduation from Ramapo College, I became a wrestling referee beginning in 2005 and remained a member of the NJWOA Central Chapter until 2020. Following my graduation from Centenary College with my MBA is when I became Treasurer in 2013. I've had the pleasure of running many tournaments with the last one being District 20 this season. I even met my wife Mary, who was a South Plainfield scorekeeper under Hall of Fame Coach Bill Pavlak, at the GMC Tournament in 2000.

I've had an incredible journey through the sport of wrestling, considering that actual wrestling was the smallest part of it. However, the biggest thing I'm looking forward to now is being a parent on the sidelines. I have four children; my daughter Annalisa (age 5), my daughter Stefana (4), my son Dominic (3), and my son Luigi (1). I have no idea if any of them will want to be involved in wrestling, but I know that I want to be there to help make whatever it is that they want to do as special as possible. I want to be there for all the ups, the downs, and the inbetweens. Again, Thank you all.
