Leeah Gutierrez, Perth Amboy




Evangelia Kotsonis, JFK Iselin

In Tyler's bloodround match, things looked bleak as he trailed 4-0 to Bergen Catholic's AJ DiGiovanni but Tyler slowly closed the gap and eventually secured a takedown to go up 5-4. After a stalling call would brought the match to overtime, Tyler found a takedown with just under 20 seconds remaining to vault himself onto the podium for the first time. The run he made inAtlantic City was very impressive as Tyler defeated multiple wrestlers that had beaten him earlier in the year.

Throughout the season Tyler was a vital part of the line up, stabilizing the middle of our line up and picked up over 20 bonus point wins this year helping lead St. Joseph to a top 20 finish in the State as a team. As only a junior Tyler picked up his 100th win and now sits at 109 wins in his career, only 16 wins away from tying the school record. Tyler already owns the school record for wins in a season, which he set as a sophomore when he went 40-5. Tyler won multiple matches down at Beast of the East, then took Gold at the John Goles Tournament, where he beat two state qualifiers from this season in the process. Tyler also picked up his 2nd GMC title, his 3rd District title, and his 1st Region title, avenging an earlier loss in the season to Rumson's Cole Pangborn, defeating him 5-2. Next year Tyler will look to become the first ever St. Joseph wrestler to win 3 GMC titles and only the 2nd to win 4 District titles.

Tyler is currently considering Drexel, George Mason, and Clarion University for college options, but the junior has plenty of time to make his decision. Look for Tyler's senior year to be a big one as he continues his ascent up the St. Joe's record books.

Zach Beadling Saint Joseph Metuchen

Zach graduates from St. Joseph High School as one of the most decorated wrestlers in the program's history. His senior year, he put together a record of 29-10, bringing his career record to 113-34 as he became the 4th wrestler in school history to eclipse the 100 win mark in his career.

Zach's senior year schedule was brutal as he encountered 3 nationally ranked wrestlers, 3 state placers, and 8 state qualifiers during his final high schoo season. Zach defeated 4 of these opponents and was very much in the match with many of the others, helping save team points during our dual meets against heavily favored opponents. Eventually Zach would finish top 24 at Beast of the East, 2nd at the John Goles Tournament, 3rd at the GMC Tournament, 1st in the District, 2nd in the Region, and won a match down in Atlantic City.

Zach finishes his career as the first ever St. Joseph wrestler to win 4 District titles going a combined 12-0 in the District tournament over his 4 years in high school. This year was especially impressive as in the District finals Zach defeated a wrestler 8-6 who had previously pinned him in the dual meet. An illustrious career saw Zach win a County championship and place 2 other times at Counties, win a Region title as a junior, and reach the Region finals as a senior. Zach also was a bonus point machine for the Falcons as 64 of his 113 wins were by fal. His presence in our line up will be extremely missed, but the senior plans to continue his wrestling career in college at either Sacred Heart University, TCNJ, or Tarleton State University who is planning to become the only Division 1 program in the State of Texas.

Senior of the Year



Noah Berlin Langston Highland Park



Noah Berlin Langston started wrestling as a sophomore. After a rough start to his career where he went 5-18 in his first season, Noah dedicated himself to getting better. He made tremendous progress between his sophomore and junior seasons and went 33-4 in his junior year winning a title at the New Providence Tournament and placing 2nd in District 20.

After a disappointing one point loss in the region wrestlebacks last year, Noah once again dedicated himself to getting better. He attended numerous clubs, camps and clinics to improve his craft. All of his hard work paid off this year as he finished his senior season with a 38-4 record.

He was 3rd at the Sam Cali Invitational, 1st in the GMC tournament, 1st in District 19 and 1st in Region 5. He became Highland Park's first state qualifier in 5 years and only our 2nd region champion in school history. His transformation over the past three years has been astonishing. He was an absolute pleasure to coach and brough all that he learned outside of our room back home to make our team better. We are certainly sad to see him go but are very pleased that he will continue his wrestling career next season at Stevens Institute of Technology in Hoboken.

Sofia Sousa earned All-Conference honors in the GMC after an exceptional junior season, finishing with an impressive 30-7 record at 165 lbs. She captured the GMC Championship title, solidifying herself as one of the top wrestlers in the conference. Olivia came into her sophomore season with something to prove. She had a disappointing end the previous year and she knew she could have done better. She started her season at Beast of the East, at her own insistence, where she went 4-2 and took 4th place. She then went on to take 2nd place at the Lady Bear Invitational. Of her 35 wins this season, 30 of them came with bonus points. Olivia went the entire regular season with only 1 win by decision against an out of state opponent.

One of Olivia's signature wins this year came early in the season against Saint Thomas Aquinas. Despite being sick and unable to practice several days before the match, Olivia chose to bump up to 114 to wrestle an opponent she lost to the prior season in the state tournament, who went on to place 6th in the state. Despite everything stacked against her, Olivia won this match 13-2. This was a pivotal moment for Olivia, and helped to be the momentum behind a 17-match win streak, beating multiple state place winners and state qualifiers along the way. Olivia won her second GMC title, but was named Outstanding Wrestler for the first time.

Throughout the season, Olivia was focused on only 1 thing: getting on the podium at Atlantic City. In a stacked weight in the Central Region, with 2 multiple-time state placewinners vying for the top 3 spots with Olivia, there was no room for error. Momentarily letting the pressure get to her almost derailed Olivia's postseason goal when she won her quarter final match by just 1 point. After losing to 2x state placewinner Ava Bonilla 6-3 in the semi final, Olivia wrestled back for 3rd place, pinning her opponent she barely beat earlier that day.

Olivia controlled her first match in Atlantic City, advancing to the quarter finals, where she would face the 1 seed and 2x state champ, Gabriella Conte. In her blood round match, Olivia secured her spot on the podium with a quick pin. Unfortunately, in her next match, Olivia was injured and unable to compete. While we know she could have climbed further up the podium, we are so proud of her for state placement.

With 64 career wins as a sophomore, 2 State Tournament appearances, and a State 8th, Olivia is already the most successful female wrestler in East Brunswick history. There is no limit to her potential and we truly believe Olivia could find a place at the top of the podium. We look forward to her future success with the Bears!

Nick earned wins against several top wrestlers in the GMC in his 120 lb weight class and narrowly missed his first Atlantic City trip placing 5th in Region 5. The future is bright for this freshman who would more than hold his own at the State level right now.

Top Team



St Joes Falcons



After a couple close wins over out of state opponents and then a close loss to rival CBA, St. Joseph started off their year with a bang finishing in the Top 30 of the Beast of the East tournament, there second highest finish ever at the tournament. From here St. Joseph would go to the 66th Annual John Goles Tournament, one of the most prestigious tournaments in New Jersey and would beat defending champion Delaware Valley by 62.5 points and at this point we thought this team might be something special. With minimal depth down low, staying under the match limits became complicated as St. Joseph was forfeiting anywhere from 1-3 matches a night but still continued it's winning ways. One of it's major highlights of the season was defeating Paramus Catholic 35-33 who at the time was #12 in the state. St. Joseph had previously been 0-5 against Paramus Catholic since restarting up it's program in 2018-19, and this was a signature win over a Big North opponent.

From there St. Joseph took off and defeated each Red Division opponent giving them their 3rd consecutive Red Division title, and 5th in a row as they had also won 2 White Division titles previous to moving to the Red Division. Entering the GMC Tournament St. Joseph put 11 wrestlers into the top 3 with 6 wrestlers making the finals, and 5 making the 3/4 matches. St. Joseph would walk away with a clean sweep winning all 6 championship matches, as well as the 5 third place matches. As a team it was St. Joseph's 3rd consecutive GMC team title. From there St. Joseph would head into the Districts with more championship aspirations. As a team they won their 4th consecutive District team title and crowned 6 individual champions and advanced 11 to the regions. In the Region 5 tournament St. Joseph took 2nd in the team scores, produced two champions in Andrew Bouchard and Tyler Whitford, and put a school record 9 wrestlers into the state tournament, which was the 5th most in the state amongst all teams. Through out the season St. Joseph defeated 2 teams that were Group Champs/Finalists, defeated 4 teams that were Group semifinalists, and defeated another 6 teams that were sectional finalists. St. Joseph's only losses came to St. Peter's Prep, CBA, Delsea, and Paramus Catholic (2nd meeting) all of whom finished in the Top 20 of the State Rankings. The overall success of this season came on the back of a senior-laden group, which led the way. This group of seniors has seen 4 Division title, 4 District titles, 3 County titles, 3 Top 20 rankings, and a Region #1 ranking in 4 years. Spotswood Chargers



This year, the Spotswood Chargers improved their record to 13-11 during the 24-25 campaign, a nine-win improvement over last year's 4-12 season. Running a similar schedule to the year prior, Spotswood avenged multiple losses they suffered throughout the 23-24 season.

The coaching staff saw the impact of the off-season work paying off from the very beginning. The Tigers opened the dual meet season with a convincing win over a tough East Brunswick team and boarded a bus the very next day to compete in the Morris Knolls Tournament capturing the team title over some very good programs in Warren Hills, Watchung Hills, and West Morris Central. South Plainfield finished the year with an overall record of 15-6. An alumni of the high school, class of 2017, JP Donatelli returned to North Plainfield to coach Football and Wrestling as a Volunteer in 2019. Since stepping away from Football in 2022, Coach Donatelli believed that the Wrestling program in North Plainfield had a lot of untapped potential. By working in the North Plainfield school district Coach Donatelli increased enrollment in the wrestling program from 20 kids to just shy of 60 kids in 3 years. Establishing a summer wrestling program in 2023 helped improve the team from a 6-13 record to a 17-10 record in 2024, which earned the 2024 Group I, II, III, Most Improved Team award. In 2024, Coach Donatelli established the first-ever girl's program, where Junior 185-pounder, Naylani Delvalle, became the program's first State Finalist since Coach Jim Miller in 1979. In 2025 the Boys Wrestling team finished with a final record of 20-5, the first 20-win season for a North Plainfield team in program history. Coach Donatelli loves to instill the sport of wrestling in the young men and women of North Plainfield because he believes that the sport of wrestling helps build tough character, an essential characteristic for a fulfilling life.



Cesar Samaniego is retiring from teaching and coaching at the conclusion of this school year. Coach Sam has worked in education for 35 years. Throughout those 35 years, wrestling has played a major role in Coach Sam's life. He has been a referee for 27 years and has had multiple coaching stops along the way. His first coaching job was with the Woodbridge Rec Dept. Then he was given his first assistant coach job at Woodbridge High School for 7 seasons from 1986-1992 with Coach Ben LaSala, friend and mentor. Here Coach Sam helped Ben take the Barrons from 1-15 the first season to 15-2, the season Ben moved on to Cranford. When LaSala left, he was replaced by Gary Kuzniak, Coach Sam's former high school coach, friend, and mentor. During their first year together, the Barrons hosted and won the District 19 title. Coach then spent the '92-93 season as Assistant Coach at Edison High School with Hall of Fame Coach Gerry Niscovaccia where he helped win another District 19 title alongside Assistant Coach Vinnie Geoffrey. Coach Sam then returned to Woodbridge Township Schools as Assistant Coach at Colonia High from 1995-1998, again with Ben LaSala and Anthony Reinoso, then as Assistant Coach at JFK with Mike Volpe whom he coached back in Rec days from 2000-2004. At JFK, Coach won the Blue Division and was awarded the GMC Assistant Coach of the Year. He eventually became Head Coach at his alma mater, JFK High School after that Coach left coaching.

At that point, Coach focused on being a wrestling official. He was a member of the Central Jersey Chapter of the NJWOA where he served as chapter secretary, vice-president, and eventually president. When Coach Monaco, whom he taught and coached at Colonia High School, took over in Woodbridge in 2018, Coach Sam returned for his second seven-year stint with the Barrons. In Coach Sam's return to Barrons Wrestling, the Barrons have recorded a 92-45 overall record, earned four NJSIAA team sectional berths, clinched their first division title, and achieved the highest county finish in eight years this season. Coach has been a tremendous role model, leader, and friend to all who know him. The Barrons wrestling program and Woodbridge Township Schools will miss Coach Sam tremendously. The Barrons Wrestling Family would like to thank him for his hard work and dedication to the program, the township, and the sport of wrestling. This may have been his last official season on the bench, but he will forever be a part of the Barrons Wrestling Family, and the GMC Wrestling Community! Coach Samaniego would like to thank his family, especially his wife Carol and children Erik and Michele for their support over the years, allowing him to do something that he loves, almost as much as them.
